

# Note from the Executive Director



We continue to make Jeremiah's Inn the best place it can possibly be by investing in the building and its surrounds. Since 2014, we've

upgraded our technology, replaced the roof, the phone system, all 47 windows & 4 exterior doors, painted the inside of the building & installed new flooring in the staff offices & library. This past fall, we renovated five bathrooms, all of the resident rooms, the stairwells and regraded and paved the parking lot and driveway, which was lovingly referred to as "the parking pool," because it had more holes (puddles) than pavement!

We will soon purchase a back-up generator & a 15-passenger van. Future plans include a new heating system, flooring in all common areas, the Nutrition Center & dining room, replacing the sink and convection oven & purchasing 10 new chairs for the conference room. We could not have accomplished all this without support from the Agnes M. Lindsay Trust,

#### **Annual Food Drive**

Some of you may remember being sent to bed without dinner for being naughty. But in Worcester, many children go to bed hungry because their family can't afford to feed them. Did you know that the prevalence of hunger in Worcester is six times that of the Commonwealth? That there are 5 Food Deserts in Worcester? Hunger & food insecurity are linked to malnutrition, cognitive & physical delays & disease & to problems such as absenteeism, lack of concentration & lower test scores. Hunger impacts our entire community!

Each year, we feed more than 11,000 people at the Food Pantry, housed in our Nutrition Center. You can help us fight food insecurity & hunger by donating food or funds during our 22<sup>nd</sup> Annual Food Drive, which will be held from July 11-16 location to be determined. Last year, we brought in more than 2,500 pounds of food and \$11,000. We hope to do just as well—if not better—this year! Stope by & help us fight huger & food insecurity in Worcester!
